

Greetings Grade Nine Students and Parents, Future SGCHS Panthers!

WE ARE COMING!

Yes, your Grade Coordinator/Counselor Team of Mrs. Nielsen and Mrs. Mennie will be visiting Gr 9 Students this month. During their visit, they want to familiarize you with both Core and Elective Courses.

What's the difference between these two types of classes? The easy answer is that Core courses are classes in the four main curricula—Mathematics, Language Arts (called English in High School)/ French Language Arts, Social Studies/Etudes Sociales and Science. Elective Courses are all the other programs available in High School including Career Technology Studies (CTS), Fine Arts, Modern Languages, Physical Education, Registered Apprenticeship Program, Social Sciences, Work Experience.

It is the correct balance of these two types of courses which will lead you to a High School Diploma, Post-Secondary Acceptance and/or the World of Work.

As a High School, our primary focus, of course, is to assist you in receiving your High School Diploma. There are very specific requirements needed to make this happen. This includes a total of 100 credits; English at the 10, 20 and 30 level; Social/Etudes Sociales at the 10, 20 and 30 level; Mathematics at the 10 and 20 level; Science at the 10 and 20 level; Physical Education at the 10 level; Career and Life Management (CALM); a minimum of 10 credits from elective courses; and 10 credits at the 30 level other than English or Social.

Of course, your Grade Coordinator/Counselor Team can help you to ensure you select classes to support both your Career and Post-Secondary aspirations, as well as your areas of interest.

Many of our students, for instance, take an introductory level of Cosmetology (hair and skin care), Construction, Foods and/or Mechanics and Fabrication (welding) because they want to learn the basics but they are not interested in a career in these areas. Others find, through taking these classes, they are on a path for the rest of their lives.

It's a great idea for you to come check out all we have to offer during our OPEN HOUSE on THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 27, 2020 from 6:30 pm through 8:00 pm. Our teachers will be on hand to speak to you about our various Departments, Programs and Opportunities. On March 19, we will have a First Time High School Parent Only Meeting here at The Comp at 7:00.

Thanks, again, to your school for allowing us some space in your newsletter. We appreciate the opportunity to reach out to you before you join us as grade 10s in the Fall of 2020.

Online Registration/Verification for 2020-2021

Online registration and verification for the 2020-2021 school year will open February 3! This process must be completed for every student each school year. Please check your email beginning February 3, 2020 for a message from "Power School Registration". noreply@noreply.psrsupport.com and follow the instructions in that email to complete the registration process.

All parents and guardians are required to complete the registration process by 4:30pm on March 20, 2020. This deadline allows us to determine the eligibility of bus pass applicants, the routing of buses, bus pass production and data verification before the summer break while schools are still operating. Any applications received after the March 20 deadline may not be processed in time for the first day of school.

Payment arrangements for bus passes must be received through Parkland School Division's online payment system (Rycor) or at the Parkland School Division Centre for Education on or before Friday, June 26, 2020 for students to be eligible to ride the bus the first day of school. Remember, if your child does not have a valid bus pass for the 2020-2021 school year, they will not be able to ride the bus.


