BOOKS GALORE

Keep books in sight as much as possible. Create a library at home, even if it is just a book basket with a few books. Then read and reread!

WORD POWER

Before kids can read, they need to understand that words are made up of sounds. Have fun talking about words!

- listen to and make rhymes (cat and bat)
- clap syllables (hap-py)
- segment words (cat = /c//a//t/)
- make up alliterations (Silly Suzy!)

THE ALPHABET

ABC's open the doors of learning to read through phonics. Teaching letter names and sounds is simple and fun!



- Uppercase/lowercase matching
- Use play dough to build/stamp letters
- Search for letters in name
- Magnetic letter play
- Read alphabet books
- Play I Spy (a letter)
- Find letters on signs, toys, cereal boxes, license plates,
- Practice beginning sounds in

READING WRITING

Reading and writing go hand in hand! Better readers become better writers. Better writers become better readers.

Start with pictures!



- 🗞 Draw a picture
- 🗞 Label the picture
- 🗞 Write or tell a story about the picture
- Draw a picture about a book you've read!

Reading for 10 minutes per day = 3,650 minutes per year!
