EMHS DRESS CODE MAY 2022

Process:

This EMHS Dress Code was created through an examination of the current dress code, discussions during 2020-2021 and 2022-2023 with teachers from grades 7-9 and most recently with further discussions with that grade 7-9 team and the entire EMHS staff on

March 28, 2022.

These discussions were followed by a survey for all staff to provide additional input. This information was examined, leading to the creation of the following dress code to be shared with students and parents for further discussion and input.

Purpose of the Dress Code at EMHS:

Students at Ecole Meridian Heights School are expected to dress in a way that is appropriate for their role as a learner in our school community. The Dress Code at EMHS has been established to define the balance of allowing students to express themselves and to be comfortable while ensuring that student attire remains appropriate for a K-9 school setting. Student dress choices must respect our school's commitment to creating a safe, caring and inclusive learning environment. The staff at Ecole Meridian Heights School recognize the shared responsibility between students, parents and staff to support our students in adhering to this dress code. The following descriptions and list of items is intended to provide further clarification on how the previously outlined purpose of the EMHS dress code will be interpreted within our school community. In acknowledging that it is not possible to pre-determine all questions that may arise regarding student attire, as other questions or circumstances present, staff will refer back to the purpose of the Dress Code at EMHS in their decision making process.

Some examples of clothing that does not align with the expectations of the EMHS Dress code are as follows:

- Attire that contributes to a hostile or intimidating atmosphere for any student,
- Attire that increases marginalization or oppression of any group based on race, sex, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, ethnicity, religion, cultural observance, household income, or body type/size.
- Attire that is unsafe for the environment (e.g. inappropriate footwear for Physical Education)
- Attire or accessories with offensive images or language, including profanity, hate speech, and/or pornography.
- Attire that denotes, suggests, displays or references alcohol, drugs or related paraphernalia or other illegal conduct or activities.
- Attire that will interfere with the operation of the school, disrupt the educational process, invade the rights of others, or create a reasonably foreseeable risk of such interference or invasion of rights.
- Attire that contains defamatory speech, or threats to others.

Some examples of clothing/attire that does currently align with the Dress Code at EMHS:

• Pants/jeans or the equivalent (for example, a skirt, sweatpants, leggings, a dress or

shorts)

- Hats; however, they must allow the face to be visible to staff, and not interfere with the line of sight of any student or staff.
- Religious headwear
- Fitted pants, including opaque leggings, yoga pants and "skinny jeans

- Ripped jeans, as long as underwear and buttocks are not exposed
- *Crop tops

*Crop tops are permitted within the dress code at EMHS but must align with the purpose as outlined previously (i.e. appropriate for a K-9 school environment). We recognize that currently there is a significant variety of styles and fits for crop tops, as such, students will work with staff to identify visuals that will more accurately outline crop tops that are appropriate for our school environment and those that are not appropriate for a K-9 environment.

Process to Address Dress Code Infractions:

Should a student's clothing not adhere to the Dress Code of EMHS as outlined above, the following process will be initiated.

• The staff member will explain to the student as discreetly as the environment permits, how the clothing item does not align with the dress code

- The student will be asked to put on a different piece of clothing if they have one.
- The student may choose to borrow a piece of clothing from a classmate or peer
- The student will be offered, when available, a piece of laundered clothing from the school
- The student and staff member may call a parent to deliver
